
Pope Francis will visit Fatima May 12-13, 2017 on the 100th Anniversary of the apparitions. He will be the fourth pontiff to visit the Fatima Marian shrine. The three other popes who paid homage, also on May 13, were Blessed Paul VI (1967), Saint John Paul II (1982, 1991, 2000) and Pope Benedict XVI (2010).

## The Importance of the Message of Fatima

It is crucial to reflect on the importance of Our Lady's message given at Fatima 100 years ago. Sister Lucia (the oldest of the three seers) disclosed the urgent call to pray and do penance. In a world plagued by uncertainty and chaos, the call to pray the Rosary daily to achieve peace for the world is as relevant today as it was a 100 years

Sister Lucia wrote in, Pathways under the Gaze of Mary, that the call to prayer and penance was for "the whole world, to all souls, to all humanity, believers & unbelievers".

Through the intercession of Our Lady, many signs and miracles were given to help strengthen the faith of unbelievers. To those who believed, Our Blessed Mother implored them to help the souls being lost by doing more acts of



reparation and expiation, sacrifice, penance and prayers because those poor souls had no one to pray for them.

She said, "Pray, pray very much, and make sacrifices for sinners: for many souls go to hell, because there are none to sacrifice themselves and to pray for them".

At each of the apparitions, Our Lady repeated the message to "Pray the Rosary every day!" There are many opportunities to pray the Rosary daily, if we just embrace them. When we drive, we could say the Rosary instead of listening to the radio. Many hours a day are spent texting, tweeting and so onwhy not dedicate some of that time to praying the Rosary?

We often become concerned over political and Church issues. Most of these situations are out of our immediate control but we can make a difference by being more active in prayer. Let us heed the call of Our Blessed Mother to pray: "O Jesus, it is for love of You, for the conversion of sinners, and in reparation for the sins committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary".

# Two Shepherd Children of Fatima Cleared for Canonization

On March 23, 2017, Pope Francis approved the second and final miracle needed to canonize Blessed Francisco and Jacinta Marto, two of the three shepherd children who witnessed the Fatima Marian apparitions. The third Fatima seer who spoke with Our Blessed Mother was Lucia. The first major step in her canonization cause was completed

They answered resolutely: "Yes, we are willing".

Let us emulate these children and practice enduring sufferings with courage and daring. bearing suffering, we can combat the culture of death which afflicts our world today.

# 100th Anniversary of Fatima Apparitions

On May 13, 1917, the Blessed Mother made the first of her six appearances to three shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal: Lucia Santos and her cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto. This was the same year that the Communist Revolution resulted in the complete overthrow of the temporal and spiritual order in Russia.

As we listen to conversations, there is frequent reference to problems in the world and within the church. It may seem as though we have lost hope. However, there is always hope! As Fr. Andrew Apostoli, so eloquently addressed in book "Fatima for Today: The Urgent Marian Message of Hope" (Ignatius Press, 2010), this source of hope is through devotion to Our Lady.

The Blessed Mother outlined a very simple and direct means of devotion during the apparitions in

In October 1917, she Fatima. announced that she was the Lady of the Rosary and asked to have a chapel built in Fatima in her honor. Every time she appeared to the children in Fatima in 1917, she continuously repeated the request to pray the Holy Rosary daily.

Our Lady also requested the First Saturday devotions. This consist of: 1) Going to Mass and receiving Holy Communion on five consecutive firsts Saturdays, 2) Going to confession within eight days of the first Saturday, 3) Reciting five decades of the Rosary, and 4) meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary for 15 minutes.

At Fatima on May 13, 1967, Pope Paul stated: "The world is in danger." Pope St. John Paul II said that this danger is due to sin. Therefore, we must pray as Our Lady requested.

Pope Benedict reminds us "Let us celebrate with grateful joy the Creator, Savior...who so loved the world that He gave His only Son...and gave Himself as bread in the Eucharistic mystery to enable us to enter His covenant which makes us His children."

Being called His children proves how much God loves us.

"For His love endures forever"!
